**Ecclesiastes** is the fourth book of the five that are classified as poetry in the Old Testament and the last of the three writings referred to as wisdom literature. The name comes from the Greek word ekklesiastes and meant a gatherer or a convener of an assembly. The Hebrew word that ekklesiastes was translated from was qoheleth and meant a speaker or a preacher. So this book is the writing of a preacher, that was also a king in Jerusalem, proclaiming what he has learned from his experiences in life.

**Authorship** is a point of debate between those accepting Solomon as the author and those rejecting him in favor of an anonymous writer at a much later date. The book does not state the authors name so lengthy arguments are made by those on both sides of the issue. If it is the work of Solomon it is suggested that it was composed sometime toward the end of his life. On the other hand, at least some of those that cling to a different writer propose a date somewhere between 300 and 200 B.C.

**The theme** of Ecclesiastes is the vanity of life. This being true we must not misunderstand the book to be one of gloom and hopelessness concerning the futility of man's limited existence. The only life that is truly vain is that which is lived with no thought toward God. So we might more correctly state the theme of Ecclesiastes to be the vanity of life <u>without God</u>. The absolute necessity of considering God in everything we do is emphasized in Ecclesiastes 12:13, "The conclusion, when all has been heard, is: fear God and keep His commandments, because this applies to every person."

**The Song of Solomon** is the last of the books of the books of poetry in the Old Testament and is also known as the Song of Songs. This very unique book is written in the form of a lyrical love song.

**The author** is stated to be Solomon and this book is thought to have been written during the Golden Age of Solomon's reign around 970-950 B.C..

**The theme** of the book expresses the value and beauty of true love between a woman and a man. To interpret it as some kind of allegory of God's love for Israel or Christ's love for the church appears unwarranted from the text.
